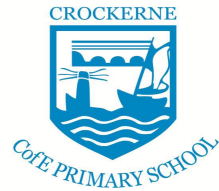

What is the PE Premium?

Each year Crockerne receives £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil in Y1-6.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

Our Philosophy

Crockerne is a healthy school. We believe every child wants to play, move and learn. We work hard to create an active and engaging environment where children and staff feel included, valued, challenged and supported to achieve their maximum potential in PE, school and life. We aim to provide each child with an exciting PE curriculum, access to competition and a wide range of sporting opportunities to help them develop physical competency, social and decision-making skills and a life long love of physical activity.

Impact

CPD

We have upskilled staff using coaches working alongside teachers to enhance delivery of football, athletics and cricket in Y1-6.

Clubs

9 extra-curricular clubs offered. 154 places used. (25PP).

Competition

20 inter-school events attended by 80 different children (196 places overall including 30PP). 7 x intra school events (all).

Target Groups

Y1- 4 groups (50 children) increased physical competency and engagement.

AOB Sports Crew established and Gold Mark Award.

Allocation of Funding

We have allocated our PE Premium Funding to continue to make year on year increases in club and competition participation, to help vulnerable pupils access sporting opportunities, to provide our staff with support, development and resources to deliver a high quality PE curriculum and to raise the profile of PE and School Sport in the school community.

Sport Premium Funding 2015-16 Impact statement.

Sport Premium Funding allocated to Crockerne Primary School was £9,230. This is made up of £8000 statutory amount and £5 per pupil age 5 and over.

Impact – measured by registers, conferencing and monitoring.

Clubs – maintained the increased provision and take up of clubs.

9 x Sports clubs offered. 2014/15 = 10 clubs.

154 places used (25 PP). 2014/15 = 176 places (26 PP).

Competition – increased participation in intra and inter school competition.

20 inter-school competitions attended. 2014/15 21 comps.

80 different children attended at least one event. 196 places overall. (30 PP). 2014/15 95 (22 PP)

All children participate in at least two **intra-school** competitions. 1 competition 2014-15.

Target groups and Teaching and Learning- improved engagement and competency of vulnerable learners, and teachers upskilled in games teaching.

Conferencing/Monitoring of Target groups in Y1-3 (38 x AFA and PP) and Y4 (12) shows increased self-esteem, confidence and physical competence. **Parent assembly** for Y4 group. 35 children 2014-15

12 PP children take up **school funded** places in clubs. **New initiative**
