

Crockerne Church of England Primary School Govenors

The Local Governing Board meet regularly throughout the academic year to monitor and evaluate the school.

The main work of the Governing Board is carried out through three committees who meet termly.

A summary of the key responsibilities of each committee are set out below.

Finance Committee

- Monitor the school budget
- Ensure the principles of best value are implemented
- Recommend a pay policy to Full Governing body
- To receive and review all policies required by statute

Educational Quality

- To monitor and evaluate academic progress and attainment
- To set attainment targets.
- To monitor and review staffing
- To monitor and evaluate behaviour
- To ensure all safeguarding arrangements are in place.
- To receive and review all policies required by statute

Ethos committee

- To monitor and evaluate the church effectiveness

Other committees

Pay committee agrees the salary levels on an annual basis. The Headteacher Performance Review panel sets the performance targets for the Headteacher and agrees the salary point on an annual basis. Panels to hear complaints, grievances and disciplinary issues are set up as required.

All governors are a member of at least one committee and have the role of a Link Governor. The link governor meets three times a year with their linked member of staff to monitor and evaluate a specific aspect of the school.
