The Governors of Crockerne Church of England Primary School will make admissions to the school in line with:

North Somerset offers a co-ordinated admissions scheme (see above), which our school adheres to. The Admission Number for the school is 45 per year group, and this is the number of places normally available within each year group. The governing body and the Local Authority, acting in accordance with national legislation, set this number.

There is a planned programme of induction for all children entering Crockerne C of E Primary for the first time. This induction programme including a 'New Parents' meeting, a morning in your new class and open door sessions if your child attends our nursery and home visits for children new to Crockerne Church of England Primary school. As lunchtimes are not part of the funded sessions, there will be a small charge to cover costs. You will need to provide a packed lunch.

Crockerne Church of England 'Acorn' Nursery is part of Crockerne Church of England Primary School and the children are able to use many of the school resources such as the library and the large school hall. The children have a safe and educationally stimulating environment. The staff consists of Mrs Tracey Whitehead (Teacher) and two nursery trained Teaching Assistants who (Mrs Judith Humphries and Mrs Paula Birch) are extremely well qualified to support your child's development.

The children have access to a well- resourced play area where they can use bikes and trikes, complete outdoor activities, and use the many toys we have available in the outside space. The nursery room is also well resourced including an interactive whiteboard to develop early computer skills as well as a large role play area, wet area for creative development and lovely book corner.

We provide a safe, caring environment where children are encouraged to develop socially and emotionally. We support the children's learning through play and ensure that they access a range of activities to develop their skills and knowledge through all seven areas of learning.

Parents are encouraged to take an active role; taking home story sacks, maths activities and reading books to share with the children. We record learning in individual learning diaries that demonstrate the children's development throughout the year in all seven

areas of learning. They contain photographs of the children and are a lovely memento of their time in our nursery.

We support all children with transition into a school environment by getting the children involved in assemblies, P.E and other whole school activities such as 'Wild Week'. This will support the children when settling into any school.

The best way to judge if our provision is right for your family is to visit the nursery and see our happy children enjoying learning through a play based curriculum. We would therefore encourage you to visit. Please telephone the school office on 01275 372659 to arrange an appointment.

We accept nursery applications from when the children are born. We hold an application register in the main school office. We aim for an intake in September following a child's third birthday . If the nursery has spaces we will also offer a January and April intake.
